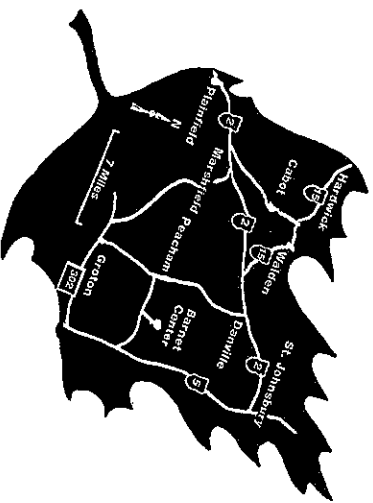


Vermont's Northeast Kingdom

The day finishes up at Harvey's Lake Beach with a free Hobo Stew Dinner starting at 4:30 (bring a can of veggies, donations welcome) with a dance at the beach from 5-9:30 pm.
