Trail Maintenance: If you have preferences on how the trails are maintained, please indicate. The Trails Committee will designate trail stewards that will monitor the trails for any necessary clearing of blowdowns, tree limbs, erosion control and drainage improvements. Prior to any trail development or improvement, trails will be marked in the field with the landowner, and any specific preferences can be noted, such as trail width, drainage and erosion control, wet area crossings, etc. If the landowner wishes to perform certain types of trail maintenance without the assistance of trail stewards, this can be noted on the landowner permission form.

Signs and Parking: The Trails Committee intends to post signs at certain trailhead access points that display trail use rules and etiquette. Trial blazes or markings will be provided to designate the trail route. For access parking that is not in a public right-of-way, the Committee will work with the landowner to identify any preferences or restrictions on parking and this can be so noted on the landowner permission form.
